The Roca Barcelona Gallery explores the recovery of rivers and city harbours in the new exhibition 'Urban Plunge'

- The exhibition displays several international projects that transform rivers and city harbours into new sustainable leisure centres
- Local proposals developed by students from four universities and architectural schools complement this exhibition

Barcelona, January 2016.- The Roca Barcelona Gallery will inaugurate the exhibition 'Urban Plunge' on the 26th January, an exposition that explores several national and international architectural projects that intend to recover and transform rivers and city harbours into new leisure spaces, thus challenging our way of thinking about water. The exhibition, which was displayed at the Roca London Gallery before coming to Barcelona, has been curated by Jane Withers, a British design consultant and co-founder of Wonderwater, an initiative specializing in projects for a sustainable use of water.

Withers has selected the five international projects that best illustrate the role played by design and architecture in the transformation of these spaces. Drawings, mock-ups and photographs of + *Pool* (Family & PlayLab), in New York; *Thames Baths* (Studio Octopi) and *King's Cross Pond Club* (Ooze & Marjetica Potrč), both in London, *Copenhagen Harbour Baths* (Julien De Smedt Architects) in Copenhagen and *Flussbad* (realities:united) in Berlin are therefore displayed. The adaptation of this exhibition in Barcelona also includes an unseen project specially designed for this exposition by the firm OAB (Office of Architecture in Barcelona) by the architects Carlos and Borja Ferrater. It is a bridge over the Besos river that would use sea water to create a fully sustainable bathing area.

Apart from these outstanding projects, 'Urban Plunge' also displays proposals developed by students from the Escola Tècnica Superior d'Arquitectura de Barcelona, UPC; the School of Architecture, UIC- Barcelona; the Escola Superior d'Arquitectura la Salle, URL and the Escola Tècnica Superior d'Arquitectura de Reus, URV, within the framework of the

contest organized by Roca. These projects have been developed by students with the aim of recovering the Port Vell (Old Port) and the Besos river to create sustainable leisure spaces.

'Urban Plunge' displays projects with new innovative ideas that enrich our relationship with rivers and city harbours, thus making our cities more human. The exhibition reflects on how our attitude towards water has an impact on the quality of life in cities.
