BROMPTON DESIGN DISTRICT EXPLORES HOW DESIGN BRINGS MEANING, VALUE AND PLEASURE TO OUR LIVES

The highly respected Brompton Design District programme expands its role as a platform for new design and exploration into how design can bring value, meaning and pleasure to our lives. Bringing together local retailers, restauranteurs and institutions, it breathes new life into the cultural heart of the neighbourhood. With engaging events around the area, from the design showrooms in Brompton Cross to the District's innovative **Pop-Up programme**, from the **Serpentine Pavilion to London Design Festival programme** at the **V&A** the Festival hub, Brompton is a leading destination in the Festival. Highlights this year include: **The Brompton Pitch**, an initiative produced by in collaboration with **Disegno**, a showcase for design which will be held on the prestigious **Exhibition Road** between 19-21 September; as well as a vibrant programme of temporary installations and exhibits showcasing new design talent.

Brompton is widely loved for its cluster of independent retailers with strong design credentials, particular personality, thoughtful service and attention to detail. Lina Kanafani, the much followed tastemaker of Mint, showcases an eclectic selection of works, Cabinets of Curiosity, inspired by curiosity and wonder. Also in store, are collaborations with renowned Czech gallery Křehký, with Svensk Form. Plus, Established & Sons to show new work by Ingo Maurer and Jo Nagasaki. Further along Brompton Road, Skandium, world leaders in Scandinavian design, with Studio Skandium presents three design studios; Stig Lindberg's illustrations feature on a new mug range, Cate & Nelson's teapot design, and Emma Lonsdale's Sunday Stroll fabric. In conjunction, a design panel discussion with Studio Skandium designers, hosted by founder Chrystina Schmidt, with special guest, author of Behind the Scenes, Hanna-Nova Beatrice.

The **Brompton Pitch** is a public event, giving participating designers a platform in the public sphere to share their work, in their which products or services will be available for sale. The Pitch, co-curated by **Jane Withers** and **Johanna Agerman Ross**, **editor in chief of Disegno**, will be an intimate set of seven stands and will present a broad spectrum of design, ranging from product design, small-scale manufacturing and consultancy through to fashion, graphics and digital design. An open call to designers, for three of

the stands, offers the opportunity for selected designers to participate. Each stand will be conceived, occupied, customised and run by an individual design team.

"We want to put things right onto the street and see how design stands up in an open forum context," says Withers. "The Brompton Pitch should inspire people to think about design in different ways. We want to hear from designers who can surprise us with what they want to show and who have a compelling reason for why they want to talk to a new audience. We want to see a different kind of dialogue about design emerging."

Squint also looks to the *Inside Story*, initiating a conversation between *Women in the Business of Design* with Squint founder Lisa Whatmough, Emily Chalmers of Caravan, Abigail Aherne of Atelier Aherne, Tamara Salman of luxury accessories brand, and Michelle Alger, Head of Home at Heal's. In the showroom, leading Korean artist and ceramicist Myung Naman, whose 'art as a lifestyle' tells stories using symbols, which are universal, and can be interpreted in your own way to evoke different moods and emotions.

Provocateur and consistently original architectural thinker **Nigel Coates**, shows **Exploded**, works on paper from his archive. Upturning convention, in the 1980s **Coates** discovered an expressionistic architectural drawing style that captures the dynamics of space. With many works shown for the first time, this unique show bridges the built and the imaginary, the building and the object.

The Conran Shop, with Jasper Conran at the helm, showcases iconic design. Another British brand, Smallbone of Devizes renowned makers of handmade furniture for kitchens and bathrooms, spotlight their British Craft values. They host craft workshops and demonstrations exploring the themes of precious metals and verre églomisé. Silversmith Ndidi Ekubia and decorative artist, Anna James. Carrying on the theme of celebrating craftsmanship, Jonathan Adler teams up with India Hicks for a dramatic window installation, featuring their large scale deconstructed interpretation of Peace + Love.

Sub-Zero & Wolf, known for their premium product and state of the art kitchen technology, launch their new generation integrated refrigeration system. **Ralph Lauren Home celebrates thirty years of iconic design**. He's a storyteller and his collections represent a way of living. At this milestone, **Ralph Lauren** introduces two distinguished collections for Fall 2013 which are dedicated to luxury and glamour; **Apartment No. One**, inspired by the Duke of Windsor, and **La Hacienda**, reinterpreting the iconic romance of the ranch, the cowboy and the western frontier.

The leading international brands on Brompton Road; B&B Italia presents *Sleep by Design* with four new beds by four iconic designers, Naoto Fukasawa, Patricia Urquiola, Antonio Citterio and Gabriele and Oscar Buratti in the setting of the London voluminous and impressive flagship store. Next door, Boffi, the indisputable leader of

the pack for sleekly designed and faultlessly detailed kitchens, bathrooms and storage systems, celebrates the *new K20 kitchen* by Norbert Wangen, recently awarded 2012 Good Design Award. Boffi transforms the showroom into a post-production food lab, *Food Remix*, with the help of food design studio Arabeschi di Latte. Guests will be invited to transform, customize and enjoy their food in a lively and creative environment. Cassina collaborates with the legendary fashion designer Karl Lagerfeld, who in *Karl Lagerfeld photographie Cassina*, reinterprets iconic pieces from the Cassina collection, extracting a sort of humanity from their form whilst creating an emotional connection.

The district is renowned for its **Pop-Up programme** curated by internationally respected curator **Jane Withers**. The programme is recognized as a significant platform for new design that reinforces contemporary engagement and the cultural richness of the area. **The Blanks in Between** presented by **Workshop for Potential Design** explores the transitional nature of industrial discards in the modern manufacturing process and the forgotten side of material culture. Swedish lighting manufacturer **Wästberg** collaborates with process-driven collective **FieldGuide** to present **StarLight**, a project that encourages people to dream far-off worlds. **StarLight** uses **NASA** data to allow people to replay the light that originated from stars light-years away, giving people a sense of connectedness to these stars. The contributors are **Paul Elliman**, **Keith Harrison**, **Gemma Holt**, **Kieren Jones**, **Peter Marigold and Study O Portable**. **1882 Ltd** brings together talent and tradition, launching the **Sand and Clay**, new works by **Philippe Malouin and Fort Standard** a collection of fine bone china tableware featuring skillfully handcrafted plates and bowls. Slip-cast from plaster models, the collection maximises the designer's beautifully minimalistic patterns through analogue 3D printing.

At 1a Cromwell Place, Harriet Anstruther Studio, a multi-disciplinary architectural interior design studio, presents *Slashstroke Magazine Space Warp in collaboration with Mirielle Fauchon and Jasleen Kaur;* a reworking / re-imagining / warping of an everyday space. Visitors are encouraged to interact with the environment and will be able to pose for and take a souvenir photograph with them to keep. A series of events will also be unfolding in the *Space Warp*. Another group show, *WORKS* collective will present *20 Lions* for a window installation at *Christie's* South Kensington. Each member will create a sculpture of a lion - a symbol long-associated with the city of London, embodying the group's philosophy of individuality and equality, whilst celebrating *Christie's* history of showcasing extraordinary art.

On Walton St, Maskells Estate Agent, host designers Laetitia de Allegri and Eva Feldkamp who present Issue No. 1, an exhibition featuring new pieces designed in collaboration as well as past solo projects. The design objects will tell their story in a landscape of colour. At the Gore Hotel, Material Subconscious showcases design lead pieces with an affiliation to traditional craftsmanship and sensitivity to materials and process. The pieces displayed in the Gothic room create a contrasting background to the contemporary design. The Adam Mickiewicz Institute (Warsaw) together with Creative

Project Foundation bring us **Young Creative Poland: 4 Years On**, hosted by **Ognisko Polish Club**, a showcase for **Polish creativity** across conceptual architecture, animation, product, graphic and food design. The show includes a recently revitalised Polish design icon: the **RM58 armchair**, designed and by **Roman Modzelewski** in 1958.

South Kensington is famous for its world-class museums and cultural institutions. Architecture and nature merge in **Sou Fujimoto's Serpentine Pavilion**, a cloud-like geometric apparition on the lawns of **Kensington Gardens**. Inspired by organic structures, Fujimoto's temporary building is a multipurpose social space, which encourages visitors to interact and appropriate it for many different uses.

The V&A for the 5th year acts as central hub for the London Design Festival. Here, the festival continues to prove that design is for everyone, not just a professional audience. Activities include installations, events, talks and workshops. The special commissions include God Is In The Details, a collaboration with Swarovski; 20 influential designers and design figures using Swarovski lenses to magnify highlights or curiosities within the V&A; The Design Fund, set up by Yana Peel, which raises money from private individuals, to create a collection of contemporary design objects for the V&A, of new, influential, innovative or experimental design, including objects by designers Joris Laarman, Fredrikson Stallard and nendo; True-to-Life Design, Scholten & Baijings will transform a room into a lived-in space with a life-like (and recently deserted) dinner setting in place, using objects from within the V&A collections. Boundaries between exclusive design and mass products will become blurred and prejudices will disappear; Cork Installation designed by FAT architecture for Amorim, the world's largest producer of cork, which challenges existing connotations with the material. It will take inspiration from the historical stone and mosaic floors of the Museum; 8-18 The Typographic Circle's Circular Magazine, an exhibition from the award-winning collectable publication from The Typographic Circle, designed by Domenic Lippa, Partner at Pentagram. Circular, issues 8-18 have no set style or consistency, each issue is designed from scratch and is unique. Work includes pieces from Vince Frost, Stefan Sagmeister, Alan Fletcher, North, Tom Hingston and Spin.

Ones to watch, **The Royal College of Art's The Sustain RCA Show & Awards** display new thinking in sustainability and sets the new agenda for sustainable design and research, offering innovative, experimental and playful ideas for the future.

Editor's notes

Leading design shops, exhibition spaces, museums and institutions on and around London's Brompton Road joined forces in 2007 to become the Brompton Design District. The area is now an international destination for design, fashion, arts and culture, known for encouraging emerging talent alongside well-established international brands and much loved independent retailers.

Unless otherwise stated, all events and activities run during the London Design Festival (14-22 Sept). Thur 19 Sept is the district's hub night and late night opening. London Design Festival Programme 2013

The festival continues to prove that design is for everyone, not just a professional audience. A broad range of commissioned activity shown throughout the Museum will include installations, events, talks and workshops, with the **Sackler Centre** acting as central information hub.

God Is In The Details: A collaboration with Swarovski to set twenty influential designers and design figures a challenge on the theme of detail, using **Swarovski** lenses to magnify highlights or curiosities within the V&A. The lens will be focused on an object's design, whether hidden, or to reveal or define a gallery view.

The Design Fund: This fund supports the acquisition of contemporary design objects at the **V&A**. It's a collection which reflects what is new, influential, innovative or experimental, and is representative of contemporary trends in design and society. Set up by fundraiser **Yana Peel** in 2011, after discussion with London Design Festival Director **Ben Evans**, their aim was to raise £100,000 per year from private patrons to fund new acquisitions. Purchases have included objects by designers such as **Joris Laarman**, **Fredrikson Stallard** and **nendo**.

True-to-Life Design: Scholten & Baijings will transform a room in the V&A into a lived-in space with a life-like (and recently deserted) dinner setting in place. Objects normally viewed behind glass or on plinths, will be changed throughout the festival, showing them in the everyday living environment, which allows a more adventurous and natural

way of viewing design. Boundaries between exclusive design and mass products will become blurred and prejudices will disappear.

Cork Installation: Amorim, the world's largest producer of cork will create an impactful installation at the V&A this year set to challenge existing connotations with the material. Designed **by FAT Architecture**, it will take inspiration from the historical stone and mosaic floors of the Museum. The presentation will demonstrate the undiscovered elegance of cork as a material for flooring in addition to showing off its inherent thermal and acoustic properties.

8 – 18 The Typographic Circle's Circular Magazine, issues 8-18

The Clore Study Area will host an exhibition from the award-winning collectable publication from The Typographic Circle. **Domenic Lippa**, Partner at world-renowned design studio **Pentagram** has been designing Circular since 1999 and describes the practice as a 'labour of love'. Circular, issues 8 - 18 have no set style or consistency, each issue is designed from scratch and is unique. Work includes pieces from **Vince Frost**, **Stefan Sagmeister**, **Alan Fletcher**, **North**, **Tom Hingston** and **Spin**. The Typographic Circle is a not-for-profit organisation formed in 1976 to bring together anyone with an interest in type and typography.

A packed programme of lunchtime talks, gallery talks, hands-on workshops and provocative debate every year. 2013 sees a more curated approach, dedicating a theme to each day of the programme, which are: Future, Materials, Making, London, Science/Nature.

Graphics Weekend: Sat 14 / Sun 15 Sept: Celebrating the creative diversity of graphic art and content across all platforms, it will consist of workshops, debates and installations around print, paper, web, typography and more. Highlights to include a typography workshop by **Type Tasting**, and digital experiment in collaborative publishing from **Six:Thirty** which will continue until 22 Sept.

Digital Design Weekend: Sat 21 / Sun 22 Sept: Celebrating collaborations in digital art, design and science, including interactive installations, bacteria textiles, hacking and tinkering projects, biotechnology, inventive electronics and more. *Garden of Russolo*, **Yuri Suzuki's** interactive installation of voice activated sound work *White Noise Machine* will be on display throughout the Festival.
